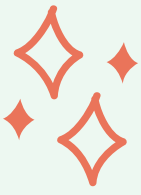

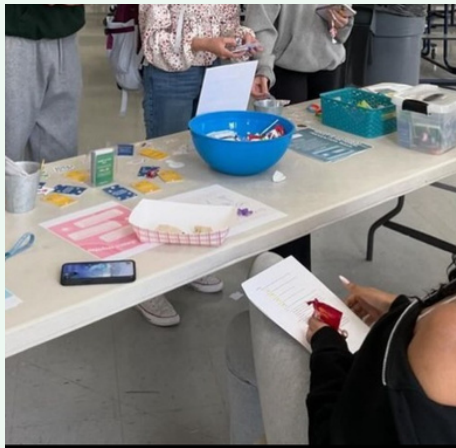
# Coalition Highlights

# Youth Sector Highlights

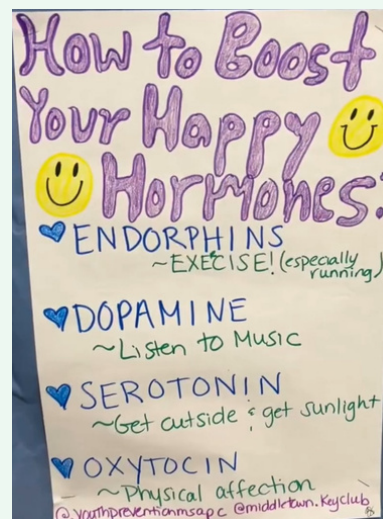


## MHS Lunch Table
